On being appointed as a LIF Trustee, Dave says: "I am delighted to join a team of fantastic people. I will do my best for my community, and by 'community' I mean all the people of Luton, who have been so good to me."

We also welcome back another familiar face back to the board, **Siobhan Rooney**, who served as a Trustee for us from 2013 to 2020. Siobhan stepped down in 2020 when her fourth child, Chester was born, although she has continued providing her expertise as volunteer legal advisor to the Board since then.

Siobhan says: "I am a second-generation Irish girl from Luton, and a partner at Pictons Solicitors. Having already been a trustee, I have some understanding of the opportunities and challenges facing LIF. I am passionate about promoting Irish culture and community in Luton, and using my own and professional networks to advance the interests of the Luton Irish Forum."

Siobhan is especially keen to support our plans to get more second and third-generation Irish locals involved in Irish cultural activities. Siobhan has four boys and is keen to teach them as much as possible about their Irish heritage. Siobhan believes that the Forum is a fantastic place to go to meet other like minded second generation Irish people and connect their families through cultural events and the St Patrick's Day Parade.

Born and bred in "lovely Galway City", **Eamonn Cunniss** discovered Luton Irish Forum when he moved to Luton half a dozen years ago and didn't know anyone locally.

A short time later, he started dance classes in the Forum which quickly became very popular. As well as being a dance teacher, Eamonn also performs as a drag artiste, in the persona of Twirley Chassie, and has been a great success entertaining guests at several of our socials.

When Covid lockdowns struck and Eamonn wasn't able to continue teaching or performing at venues around and about, he decided to perform at home and live stream the performances as fundraisers for charity. The idea was a hit and Eamonn donated a hefty £900 each for both Luton Irish Forum and the Alzheimer's Society.

Eamonn explains why he's taken up the volunteer role as Diversity Champion with us: "LIF is a great community organisation and an outlet for everyone. It really helped me when I came to Luton, but not enough people know about us and this is a fantastic opportunity to offer my services.

"I share my ideas to help bring Irish culture to a wider range of people and to get members out and about more, so they're not sitting at home on their own."

Lisa Mannion, our new Cultural Officer, has a background in theatre and production and most recently worked for Arts In Action at Galway University where she organised events and ran a mentor programme. She has also been a Curator with the Town Hall Theatre in Galway as part of their Young Curators Programme for the past two years.

Lisa moved to Luton in May 2022 to develop her career and says: "I'm really enjoying it at LIF. Everyone is so lovely and made me feel welcome."

One of her priorities is in the organising of Luton St Patrick's Festival 2023 where she will be using her contacts as part of the local youth network to get younger generations of Irish people involved in both planning and attending Festival events.

"If you're a promising young Irish act that wants to perform locally – or you want to help create events and attractions for a younger following, please get in touch, I want to hear from you," says Lisa.
